## ***Bishop Gene Robinson's Prayer***

Lincoln Memorial, Washington, DC  
January 18, 2009*

*Welcome to Washington! The fun is about to begin, but first, please join me in pausing for a moment, to ask God's blessing upon our nation and our next president.*

*O God of our many understandings, we pray that you will...*

*Bless us with tears – for a world in which over a billion people exist on less than a dollar a day, where young women from many lands are beaten and raped for wanting an education, and thousands die daily from malnutrition, malaria, and AIDS.*

*Bless us with anger – at discrimination, at home and abroad, against refugees and immigrants, women, people of color, gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender people.*

*Bless us with discomfort – at the easy, simplistic "answers" we've preferred to hear from our politicians, instead of the truth, about ourselves and the world, which we need to face if we are going to rise to the challenges of the future.*

*Bless us with patience – and the knowledge that none of what ails us will be "fixed" anytime soon, and the understanding that our new president is a human being, not a messiah.*

*Bless us with humility – open to understanding that our own needs must always be balanced with those of the world.*

*Bless us with freedom from mere tolerance – replacing it with a genuine respect and warm embrace of our differences, and an understanding that in our diversity, we are stronger.*

*Bless us with compassion and generosity – remembering that every religion's God judges us by the way we care for the most vulnerable in the human community, whether across town or across the world.*

*And God, we give you thanks for your child Barack, as he assumes the office of President of the United States.*

*Give him wisdom beyond his years, and inspire him with Lincoln's reconciling leadership style, President Kennedy's ability to enlist our best efforts, and Dr. King's dream of a nation for ALL the people.*

*Give him a quiet heart, for our Ship of State needs a steady, calm captain in these times.*

*Give him stirring words, for we will need to be inspired and motivated to make the personal and common sacrifices necessary to facing the challenges ahead.*

*Make him color-blind, reminding him of his own words that under his leadership, there will be neither red nor blue states, but the United States.*

*Help him remember his own oppression as a minority, drawing on that experience of discrimination, that he might seek to change the lives of those who are still its victims.*

*Give him the strength to find family time and privacy, and help him remember that even though he is president, a father only gets one shot at his daughters' childhoods.*

*And please, God, keep him safe. We know we ask too much of our presidents, and we're asking FAR too much of*

*this one. We know the risk he and his wife are taking for all of us, and we implore you, O good and great God, to keep him safe. Hold him in the palm of your hand – that he might do the work we have called him to do, that he might find joy in this impossible calling, and that in the end, he might lead us as a nation to a place of integrity, prosperity and peace.*

*AMEN.*

### **Right Rev. Gene Robinson to Deliver Invocation for Inaugural Concert at Lincoln Memorial**

Robinson is first openly gay priest to be ordained bishop by Episcopal Church.

The Right Rev. V. Gene Robinson, bishop of the U.S. Episcopal Church in the diocese of New Hampshire has accepted an invitation from President-elect Barack Obama's inaugural committee to deliver the invocation at a concert held at the Lincoln Memorial. The concert, which will be held on Sunday, January 18th, is the first inaugural event the president-elect will attend. Bishop Robinson, the first openly gay priest to be ordained bishop by a major Christian denomination, is a member of the Human Rights Campaign Religion Council

Bishop Robinson models what prayer should be—spiritual reflection put into action for justice," said Human Rights Campaign President Joe Solmonese. "It is encouraging that the president-elect has chosen this spiritual hero for all Americans to lead the nation in prayer at the Lincoln Memorial inaugural concert."

Bishop Robinson is the co-author of three AIDS education curricula for youth and adults and has done extensive work on AIDS in the United States and in Africa. He helped build the Diocese of New Hampshire's close working partnership with the New Hampshire Community Loan Fund, advocated for debt relief for the world's most impoverished nations, and lobbied for socially responsible investment within and beyond the Church. He currently serves on the Board of the New Hampshire Endowment for Health, which works for access to health care for the uninsured. He also serves as a Trustee of the Church Pension Fund.



# Inaugural-Themed Facebook `Online March for LGBT Equality` Gains Momentum

**T**ens of thousands have already joined virtual protest planned for Inauguration Week

January 13, 2009: Equality Matters, an organization working for LGBT equality, launched "Online March for Equality" to coincide with the historic Inaugural activities for President-Elect Barack Obama, scheduled from January 17 to 24. Organizers are asking members of Facebook and other social media sites to change their profile pictures to one of several "badges" created by the group. The badges highlight the critical rights being denied LGBT Americans, including the ability to file joint taxes, make medical decisions for a spouse, sponsor a partner for immigration or receive government benefits such as Social Security.

"If the gay community is going to achieve equality, we need to find new ways to educate the American public and reach them where they spend their time. We felt the best way to achieve that was to take advantage of the web and sites like Facebook," said Bruce Namerow, founder of Equality Matters.

A March 2008 Witeck-Combs Communications/Harris Interactive poll showed that a majority (57%) of gay adult men online declare they are a member of a social networking web site, compared to 37 percent of heterosexual men. Also, two out of five (42 %) gay and lesbian adults have visited an online social community or network in the last month, compared with roughly a third (32%) of heterosexuals.

Since its launch just over one week ago, the Facebook event has attracted more than 150,000 invited guests with more than 46,000 registering their intent to "attend" this virtual event. The figures continue to grow rapidly and organizers are hopeful that participants will exceed 100,000 before the event begins on January 17.

The power of social networking sites such as Facebook demonstrate why this medium is an ideal way to educate a broader audience on

issues such as marriage equality. A London study showed that most Facebook users have an average of 150 people, or "friends," in their network, meaning that this campaign has the potential to conservatively reach over 22 million people.

"The goal of the campaign is to ensure people have a dialogue about what rights and benefits LGBT individuals are denied by not being allowed to get married. Gay and straight individuals alike may be unaware that there are 1,138 federal laws in which marital status is a factor in determining or receiving benefits, rights and privileges," Namerow said.

The idea was born after Namerow saw more than 100,000 protesters take to the streets on November 15 – just eleven days after voters in California, Arizona and Florida passed ballot initiatives outlawing same-sex marriage. The Internet and social media sites like Facebook are credited with helping quickly spread the word and making the protests possible.

"News reports said that a main reason Proposition 8 passed in California was that those who supported such a law were never educated about what was really at stake for same sex couples. If more Californians were made aware of the rights

and benefits denied same sex couples that are unable to marry, my guess is that there would have been a different outcome in that election," added Namerow.

While the Facebook event page is the center of the group's efforts, organizers have also launched a website at [www.equalitymatters.org](http://www.equalitymatters.org) that is intended to educate visitors about the issue. It includes a detailed list of 1,138 rights and responsibilities that are denied gay and lesbian couples by federal law. The number 1,138 comes from a government report issued by the Government Accounting Office (GAO) in 2004 and available for download at the site.

# No Name-Calling Week Brings Tolerance to Thousands of Schools Next Week

Thousands of elementary and middle schools will participate in the sixth annual No Name-Calling Week next week to educate students about tolerance and to foster a dialogue among students about why bullying and name-calling is wrong.

Aimed at grades 5-8, No Name-Calling Week is a week of educational activities designed to end name-calling and bullying of all kinds. The program is a project of GLSEN, the Gay, Lesbian and Straight Education Network, and Simon and Schuster Children's Publishing, in collaboration with nearly 50 national education and youth service organizations.

"Name-calling and bullying are creating unsafe environments in America's schools, which is hindering student performance," said GLSEN Executive Director Dr. Eliza Byard. "No Name-Calling Week is an opportunity for schools to engage their students in discussions about understanding differences and treating everyone with respect. Such a simple message has a profound impact."

Most schools participating in No Name-Calling Week use lesson plans and resources available at [www.nonamecallingweek.org](http://www.nonamecallingweek.org). Lesson plans are available for grades K-8.

Schools also participate in the accompanying Creative Expression Contest that encourages students to create a work that expresses their thoughts on bullying and name-calling. Student entries range from

songs to artwork to poems to videos. Deadline for the contest is Feb. 13.

Also available this year is a special educator's guide that allows teachers to incorporate GLSEN's Think B4 You Speak public education campaign into No Name-Calling Week. The campaign, created in partnership with the Ad Council, encourages students to think before they say hurtful terms such as "that's so gay." Public service announcements featuring Hilary Duff and Wanda Sykes are airing nationwide. The educators guide is available in the For Educators section at [www.ThinkB4YouSpeak.com](http://www.ThinkB4YouSpeak.com).

No Name-Calling Week was inspired by the young adult novel, *The Misfits*, by popular author James Howe. The book tells the story of four best friends trying to survive the seventh grade in the face of all too frequent name-calling, bullying and harassment. The students create a "No Name Day" at school in hopes of creating a safer environment.

No Name-Calling Week Coalition partners include the National Association of Secondary School Principals, the National Association of Elementary School Principals, Girl Scouts of the USA, the National School Boards Association and the National Education Association.

In GLSEN's 2005 report, *From Teasing to Torment: School Climate in America*, 47 percent of junior/middle high school students identified bullying, name-calling or harassment as somewhat serious or very serious problems at their school. Additionally, 69 percent of junior/middle high school students reported being assaulted or harassed in the previous year and only 41 percent said they felt very safe at school.

# LGBA chooses inspiring music for the Obama Inaugural Parade



The Lesbian and Gay Band Association (LGBA), a musical organization comprising marching and concert bands from across the United States and around the world, is proud to announce the five musical selections it will perform during the parade for President-elect Barack Obama's inauguration on January 20, 2009. LGBA is the first lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender group in history to be invited to march in a President's Inaugural Parade.

essential piece in marching band literature. Sousa, a Washington, D.C., native and an American composer of patriotic music and marches, was nicknamed the March King. 'Washington Post,' written in honor of the award-winning newspaper of the same name, is a familiar tune that will delight the inauguration day parade-goers and demonstrate the LGBA band's pride in its American heritage and in this cherished musical tradition."

For the 25-minute, 1.6-mile parade, Majors says the LGBA band will perform a total of five pieces, each of which speaks to a different aspect of Americans' hope and pride during this historic inauguration. "Ode to Joy," by Ludwig van Beethoven, is a beloved hymn to fellowship among people and echoes the Obama campaign idea of one America that includes us all. The band will play a spirited marching arrangement of this 1824 composition by Beethoven that is part of the beloved Ninth Symphony.

"Hold On, I'm Comin'," a 1960s R&B hit on the Atlantic Records label, evokes the aspirations of the American people for the future and for the Obama presidency. The marching arrangement the LGBA band will play has an infectious driving rhythm sure to electrify the crowds along the parade route.

"Brand New Day," from the hit musical "The Wiz" (the first Broadway re-telling of "The Wizard of Oz"), heralds the dawn of a new era. As the lyrics of the song say, "Everybody look up, and feel the hope that we've been waiting for" and "show the world that we've got liberty."

Finally, "Manhattan Beach," another Sousa march, will continue the theme of our American musical heritage on parade. This well-loved piece was written in 1893 to honor the Brooklyn beachfront neighborhood of the same name where the March King and his band once gave summer concerts.
